Fraud Newsletter January 2018

Please see attached this month's Fraud newsletter. Highlights include advice on three different types of online fraud to look out for – particularly requests from your bank to well established shopping websites. We also provide some preventative tips to take if you're booking a holiday.

Crime Summary

Chichester (WC1)

Whyke Road, Chichester – Between 4.30 pm on Wednesday 17 January and 8.50 am on Thursday 18 January, a property was broken into and tools stolen. Serial 0332 of 18/01.

Mosse Gardens, Chichester – Overnight on Saturday 13 January, an insecure vehicle was entered and loose change stolen. Serial 0290 of 15/01.

Selsey, The Witterings and surrounding area (WC2)

Earnley Manor Close, Earnley – Between Saturday 13 January and Tuesday 16 January a property was broken into and a 40" Samsung TV stolen. The garden shed had also been forced open; nothing was reported stolen. Serial 0613 of 17/01.
